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ASSIGNMENT

First, please purchase and read a copy of *Night* by Elie Wiesel (ISBN: 978-0374500016). In addition, please read Job 1-10 in any version of the Bible.

While reading *Night* by Elie Wiesel, you are required to fill out the attached guided annotation chart. **You will type and submit a digital copy of this chart to Turnitin on the first day of school**. I will **NOT** accept a physical copy.

Think of annotating in terms of having a conversation with the author in real time. It improves your understanding, increases what you remember, and prepares you to participate in classroom discussion. **The guided annotation chart will be worth 25 points in your Formative Assessments category**.

In addition to annotating the text, you will have a timed writing **AND** exam over *Night* by Elie Wiesel within the first two weeks of school. We will discuss the exact dates on the first day of school. **The timed writing will be worth 50 points in your Writing/Projects category**. **The exam will be worth 100 points in your Summative Assessments category**.
