7th Grade English/Advanced English Summer Reading Assignment

Part I - All Classes -

<u>Read with a colored pencil</u>. While you read, underline sections of the text that you do not understand. Circle words you do not know; write comments and questions in the margins. Think about the text while you are reading. This will help you as you work on the following tasks and as you participate in classroom discussion.

Part II - All Classes - Complete the Folder Project.

Part III - Advanced Only - Complete the Character Analysis.

Folder Project (100 points total)

Folder - Choose any folder with three prongs (to bind papers inside) to represent your learning and understanding of the novel.

The Outside (20 pts.) - Decorate the folder with multiple details, symbols, and themes found in the book. Include the book title and author. Your name and class period must show clearly on the outside.

Symbolism is a literary device that uses symbols (concrete) to represent something beyond the literal meaning (abstract).

The Inside - The inside of the folder must include the following materials pertaining to the book:

1. Theme (20 pts) - Identify an overall theme from the novel. Identify that theme and write a paragraph (five sentences) explaining the theme, in detail, using textual evidence to support your reasoning.

Theme is the message of the story that the author is conveying; it is what the author is teaching the reader about life.

- 2. Chapter Analysis (50 pts.) Choose <u>five chapters</u> from the book, but they should not be consecutive (following one after another/in order). Use separate pieces of paper for each chapter. Include the following on each page of your chapter analysis:
 - Characters A brief description of the characters in the chapter. Include items such as looks, character traits/personality, etc.
 - Setting Where/when the chapter takes place
 - Personal Reaction How can you relate to what is happening in the chapter? What has happened in your life that is similar? Does it remind you of something? What did you think of the plot (the storyline/events)? Did you enjoy it? Why? Did you not enjoy it? Why not?
 - Illustration Illustrate the imagery that comes to mind as you read the chapter. This should be hand-drawn and colored.

Class Presentation (10 pts.) - This will take place during the first two weeks of school.

Directions: Once you have chosen the novel that you will read, you must first complete the folder project. In addition, you are to complete following Character Analysis for the given characters within the novel. Choose one character per the book you read. Include the Character Analysis sheets within the folder.

List at least five different adjectives for the character, by providing two pieces of evidence from the book, along with the page #/chapter that shows those characteristics.

- If you are reading True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle, complete a character analysis for ONE of the following characters: Charlotte Doyle, Captain Jaggery, Zachariah.
- If you are reading True North, complete a character analysis for ONE of the following characters: Afrika, Lucy
- If you are reading The Call of the Wild, complete a character analysis for the following character: Buck
