HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE AND STEM ACTIVITIES






Chemistry students studied the types of chemical reactions and practiced writing, predicting, and balancing them. At the end of the unit, students used these reactions to cause a chemical change in the pumpkins.





Introduction to Engineering Design students worked through the "Puzzle Design Challenge." Students were challenged to create a desktop novelty item (puzzle cube) from thousands of scrap hardwood cubes that are a byproduct of a company's manufacturing process.

The students presented these to several judges who scored them on several criteria.

HUNGER WALK

A different high school art student is featured as the Artist of the Month with their work displayed in the front entrance at the Rose Campus.






ATHLETICS

Fall 2021 brought back a more traditional sports season. We, once again, had fans in the stands cheering on our student athletes.


LCA GIRLS GOLF




LCA BOYS GOLF
